The applicants, Nicholas Miserendino and Tammy Miserendino were sworn in by Mr. Haggerty and provided testimony. Their variance application requested permission to construct a barn which will be larger than the 1000 sq. ft. allowable limit. It will be used to store the applicant's personal equipment and will not be utilized for any commercial use. They purchased the property from his father who has owned it since 1950. The property is farmland assessed with a woodland management program.

Jason Dunn from Dykstra Walker also testified on the applicants' behalf. He provided the Board with an overview of the plans and discussed the decision for placement of the barn due to steep slopes and wetlands on the property.

The matter was opened to the public at 7:38pm. There being no public comment, the matter was closed to the public.
